Action 12 – Revitalise Rugby Health & Wellbeing Forum – After further discussion FP has decided not to go ahead with this and GD will not take this forward. Co-ordinating Group dates - AO is meeting with Simon Betteridge at a partnership meeting and will liaise with FP to see who can be nominated to AO go on to this group. 8. – Voluntary & Community Sector – collaborative funding pot – LH met with Cemex to discuss grants. Cemex allocate grants all year round using 2 funds (Cemex and Rugby Cement). They can also help with projects. 3. **Feedback from Co-ordinating Group** Paul Tolley was not at the meeting to give an update and the group has not met since the last meeting. The Regeneration Action Plan will be on the agenda to be discussed at the next meeting on 21 April. Mark O'Connell (WCC) – overview of road safety across the Borough 4. Mark attended to give an overview of road safety within the borough. WCC are currently working with a new database (RASJ – which is a handheld device that is used at the scene and can report more serious collisions). Overall Rugby does not perform well on all categories in relation to road traffic accidents. To try and combat this, various campaigns and initiatives are taking place across the borough to educate road users using the followina: Develop packages and market the services for the whole group Provide main liaison activities for the whole group with Local Members, the community and businesses Road safety education – pre-school, primary & secondary Working in areas of disadvantage Develop road safety awareness campaigns Manage the School Crossing Patrol Service Updates on works currently taking place across the borough include: Lutterworth Road, Bramcote – resurfacing Daventry Road and Woolscott Road in Willoughby Lutterworth Road junction with Leicester Road Technology Drive

5. Fran Poole re Public Health Annual Review

This is a statutory requirement.

The Public Health Annual Review report highlights health and wellbeing leads. Headlines include:

- Physical activity in adults have improved in Rugby
- Physical inactivity has greatly reduced
- Smoking in pregnancy is now below the England average
- Teenage pregnancies continue to fall
- Dementia Friends in Warwickshire have increased

Public Health are currently looking at falls and the prevention of falls and this service will be going out to tender next year.

Pre-diabetes and cancer recovery has also now been added to the criteria for Fitter Futures.

Rugby's priorities are:

- Tackling obesity
- Mental Health promotion, Dementia awareness
- Physical activity
- Drugs and alcohol
