Thank you for consulting Network Rail on the above planning policy relating to CIL.

Network Rail is a statutory consultee for any planning applications within 10 metres of relevant railway land (as the Rail Infrastructure Managers for the railway, set out in Article 16 of the Development Management Procedure Order) and for any development likely to result in a material increase in the volume or a material change in the character of traffic using a level crossing over a railway (as the Rail Network Operators, set out in Schedule 4 (J) of the Development Management Procedure Order).

Network Rail is also a statutory undertaker responsible for maintaining and operating the railway infrastructure and associated estate. It owns, operates and develops the main rail network. Network Rail aims to protect and enhance the railway infrastructure, therefore any proposed development which is in close proximity to the railway line or could potentially affect Network Rail's specific land interests will need to be carefully considered.

As you will be aware, the CIL Regulations enable the Local Planning Authority to set differential rates (including zero rates) for development in both specific geographical areas or for specific land uses across the charging area. As a Statutory Undertaker, responsible for safely maintaining, repairing & developing railway infrastructure in England, Scotland and Wales, it is requested that all development undertaken by Network Rail in relation to operational business is specified in the charging schedule as 'zero/nil rated'. This includes development authorised under the provisions of The Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015, in addition to developments for which an application for planning permission (or related consents) is submitted. Network Rail seeks to support economic growth and connectivity, through targeting investment across the network. The LPA's infrastructure funding statement should identify infrastructure needs in relation to the rail network, recognising opportunities for targeted investment. Network Rail is happy to work collaboratively with the LPA to identify opportunities for investment, including identification of headline costs and how CIL should be harnessed to enable schemes' delivery.
