## Public Report of the Chief Officer - Legal and Governance

## Recommendation

## 1. Introduction

1.1 Under the Council's Constitution it falls to this meeting to approve the constitutional arrangements and the allocation of seats to party groups for this municipal year.
1.2 Following this year's elections, the Council now has the following groups Conservatives with 17 seats, Labour with 15 seats and Liberal Democrats with 10 seats.
1.3 The Group Leaders have met with the Chief Executive and agreed that the seats on the committees be allocated as shown in the table in Appendix 1 to this report.

## 2. Audit and Ethics Committee

2.1 The Audit and Ethics Committee consists of six non-Cabinet members, two of whom will be independent of the Council and who will be the Chair and Vice Chair. It is proposed that four Councillors be appointed to the Committee. It is also proposed that Paul Dudfield and John Eves continue in their roles as Chair and Vice-Chair respectively of the Committee.
2.2 Under the Council's Constitution, no member of the Scrutiny Committee may be a member of, or named substitute for, Audit and Ethics Committee. Members of the Committee are also required to appoint a named substitute each.

## 3. Shareholders Committee

3.1 The Shareholders Committee consists of six non-Cabinet members, one of whom will be independent of the Council and who will be the Chair. It is proposed that five Councillors be appointed to the Committee. It is also proposed that Paul Shackley continues in his role as Chair of the Committee.

## 4. Appointments to Committees

4.1 The appointments to committees will be made once members of Cabinet have been agreed for the municipal year. Appeals and Grievance Committees will be appointed to if they are required to meet during the municipal year. The appointment of Chairs and Vice-Chairs of all other Committees will be made at their first respective ordinary meetings.
