	The building will use a modern and robust modular build system, that delivers quality design to complement the historic significance of the site.
	The building is sited in association with the other modern educational facilities, creating a three 'wing' layout that will not harm the protected trees on site.
	4. The scheme will see the loss of three parking spaces, however with the Schools sustainable location in Rugby Town this is not considered to have a detrimental impact on the proposal.
	 Overall, the public benefit the scheme delivers is seen to outweigh any harm caused (all be it extremely minimal) to the protected heritage assets.
	Accordingly, the application is considered to be in accordance with the NPPF and the Local Plan.
