


DECISION UNDER DELEGATED POWERS

Subject	Public Space Protection Orders - Renewal

Officer Making the Decision	Executive Director
Authority for Decision	<p>Paragraph 2.1(a) of Part 2B of Rugby Borough Council Constitution:</p> <p>The Executive Director is authorised, subject to 2.2 to exercise for Full Council in cases of urgency in consultation with the Leader (or Deputy Leader) of the Cabinet and the relevant Portfolio Holder and the Leader (or nominee) of the main opposition group, to make decisions which shall include key decision and shall require the approval of the Chair of the Scrutiny Committee and shall be reported to the next ordinary meeting of Full Council.</p>
Recommendation	<p>1: Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) Dog Controls: based on the evidence, following consultation, it is recommended the Council goes forward with the PSPO renewal for a further 7 months.</p> <p>2: Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) Intoxicating Substances: based on the evidence, following consultation, it is recommended the Council goes forward with the PSPO renewal for a further 7 months.</p> <p>3: Public Space Protection Order (PSPO), Newbold Quarry Nature Reserve: based on the evidence, following consultation, it is recommended the Council goes forward with the PSPO renewal for a further 7 months.</p>
Alternatives considered and rejected	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To renew the PSPOs for an alternative time frame. 2. To not renew the PSPOs.
Decision	Approve
Reason	The PSPOs expire on 4th March 2022 and need to be renewed prior to that date. The renewal

	<p>recommendations are based on evidence gathered following a consultation process. The Council is satisfied that the PSPOs should be extended because:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) activities carried on in a public place within the authority's area have had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality; or (ii) it is likely that activities will be carried on in a public place within that area and that they will have such an effect. (iii) the effect, or likely effect, of the activities is, or is likely to be of a persistent or continuing nature, such as to make the activities unreasonable, and therefore justifies the restrictions imposed by the PSPO.
